On discussion of Agenda Item 14050 it was agreed that a Sub committee of Kathy Ernst, Kevin Taylor and John Reid to compile a report and recommendations of on-site vehicles for the OC. Mark Rassmussen provided contact for Phil Ross from Denni Wreckers 0418 340 491.	

A big thank you to all on the healthy discussion of Agenda Item 14057 regarding the Bylands Bore.

John Reid had a concern that if not used we might loose our bore license. Another option John suggested was to perhaps obtain a quote to either extend the current bore or to drill a new bore hole to try and try and tap into a different acquafa. As they test drill they do take samples of the water. Also although the water at Bylands is not drinkable, for a small gathering it would still be useful for washing etc. Rainwater tanks are sensible, but John believes keeping our bore would be a wise investment if we were to sell.

David Cruise, in two minds, agrees with John Reid but advised the information Walter received was that we would have no guarantee that we would get better water if we went down further which would cost more money to increase the bore. David has done a calculation of the rainfall in the area and said we have a 20,000 litre tank plus the ability to collect on average 50,000 litres a year from the big shed already on-site at Bylands. There is also 2inch pipe running from the creek up to the house/tank which we could pump up. David feels we would be wasting our money by repurposing the bore, we just need to put in our own labour to collect water from the roof.

Robin Macpherson feels it requires not just one decision but a series of decisions that take advantage of our environment as it currently is and the most appropriate water for water use. Moving existing tanks when they're settled as it could be fraught with difficulties, Robin likes David's suggestion of a tank off the shed but thinks it should be a new tank which would give us nice drinking water. The area around the shed is a nice clear area, no overhanging trees. Robin also would like us to look long term at water security and have the bore pump repaired. He suggests that as long as that bore pump could potentially be used in a new bore further down the hill where if we were to be lucky enough like Gulpa Creek, we would get absolutely beautiful drinking water. Robin sees this as a process over 2 to 3 years, pump just to keep this one going, rainwater tank to take advantage of the current weather. New bore in the end.

Ian Hales agrees David has covered this very well, the key point that Ian feels hasn't been mentioned yet, we have various options and one is the most expensive option which is redoing the bore at the moment with no guarantee of quality water if we were to spend \$4,700. The key point to be established is what are our long term

plans for Bylands, no good spending large amounts if we are not using it as this couldn't be justified. Perhaps with the small gathering bringing in water with a tanker may be the cheaper option.
